

Turn to mountPlace The **One** in a 90 degree angle on the mount, then turn The **One** 90 degrees to the front.


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
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
Firmly secured

The **One** is secured tightly within the mount, thanks to the mount's rubber ring. Because the ring is rubber, you won't detect a noticeable click when inserting The **One**. This is the most robust type of fixture possible.



Standard mount


Evenly tighten the bolts from beneath to 4Nm. Make sure you don't lock any cables inside the mount.



Extension mount

Screw to the bottom of the handlebar according to handlebar specs (if not available we recommend 2Nm).

Note on positioning: make sure to leave enough space to install The **One** on your mount!



Stem mount

Remove the two bottom bolts from your stem. Place the spacers between the handlebar and the mount. Then screw the bolts evenly to 4Nm.



Pin joint mount

Fit the mount in the adaptor on the handlebar. Then tighten the screw to 4Nm.
